

LOVE CONNECTS US ALL: FACTS ABOUT THE FILM


Director Philip Lyall met Eva as a theater student when they were both attending UVIC.

Directors/Producers Philip Lyall and Nimisha Mukerji met in film school at UBC where they recruited cinematographer Mike Rae (who was their TA), fellow student Adam Lock-Norton who became the film's composer, and photographer/med student Cyrus Mechecran who created the images with Eva that sparked a province-wide awareness campaign for organ donation.

The inclusion of Dan Mangan's music as the closing track of the film came from Eva, who was a fan and recommended the filmmakers reach out to him.

When 65_RedRoses released in 2009 it had a different ending than it's current one. Additional interviews and footage were included before the film premiered on Oprah's Documentary Club.

After it's release BC Transplant credited 65_RedRoses with helping to triple organ donation rates in the province.
